# SUPPORTING CANADIANS TO NAVIGATE LEARNING AND WORK - PROJECT UPDATE

As the Supporting Canadians to Navigate Learning and Work project wraps up, I would like to extend my deepest gratitude and sincere appreciation to you, the career development community in Alberta, for your support of and involvement with the project. Your contributions enabled the creation and development of the following project assets:

- Career Development Professional National Competency Framework
- National Competency Profile for Career Development Professionals
- National Industry Standard for CCDP Certification
- Certification Process including a bilingual exam and performance assessment
- Code of Ethics for Career Development Professionals
- Three post-secondary micro-credentials

With respect to national certification, it is important to know that while the certification process has been pilot tested and refined much work remains to be done before the certification program can be launched. CCDF has submitted a proposal for funding to ESDC which focuses on the critical transition from program development to program implementation. Receiving this new funding will secure the legacy of the investment made by the Government of Canada by achieving sustainable and integrated implementation of the certification program.

On October 15, 2021 CCDF provided an update regarding the proposal that was submitted to ESDC. "The new sector funding seems to be quite popular, and with last month's federal election they're running a bit behind on what sounds to be a much larger workload than they expected. We will be sure to keep you in the know on our status going forward.

While all of our project's work has been completed in English, many of those same processes are being replicated in French to ensure that all the assets are of equal quality. Translation brings a powerful strength and clarity to a finished product and we anticipate that the final documents will reflect this. Anticipation to use the full competency framework and the code of ethics is certainly mounting, and we are thankful that NSC and NCSC members have agreed to use their incredible patience and positions of privilege to wait for bilingual publication of all our remaining assets instead of using unpublished and drafted documents that have been circulated in advance. Like you, CCDF has committed to holding tight and waiting to begin the work of aligning our courses to the full competency framework and the Code of Ethics until translation is complete and these are formally published.

We are expecting that the Code of Ethics will be complete and ready to share by next Friday, October 22nd. When made available online, I will send a PDF copy to you directly, and include some bilingual email copy to share through your networks. We will be sure to connect with you again when the final competencies are made available, and when we hear more from ESDC about our proposal. While the project may have officially ended, the work to implement, maintain, update and grow our collective work is still top of mind!"

The CDAA will continue to share updates and information related to the project and the work that remains to be done. We are very excited for what this all means for our profession!

The CDAA is very excited to be partnering with CERIC during Canada Career Month to host a three part webinar series delivered by Jodi Tingling, MSW, RSW on November 18, 25, December 2, 2021. As a career practitioner it is vital to understand the systems that serve to harm or hinder the career trajectories of those who are racialized. The research is clear, the systems in place can negatively impact their careers as they face many barriers that alter their recruitment, hiring, advancement and retention in the workforce. Although there has been some progress in businesses recognizing the need to have a diverse, inclusive and equitable workforce, more work needs to be completed to dismantle the systems that continue to contribute towards promoting and harming those who are racialized.
